# Who can be awarded these scholarships?

These \$100 scholarship awards are available to students who are residents of Dunn County, Wisconsin, currently enrolled in High School or College. Preference will be given to students currently enrolled in one or more school music classes. Applicants must have auditioned and been accepted for active current season membership in a Junior Drum & Bugle Corps incorporated in the United States of America, one that is a non-profit 501(c)(3) youth organization maintaining the same membership age requirements as Drum Corps International, Inc. ([www.dci.org](http://www.dci.org))

## What are the Requirements?

1. You must be enrolled in High School or college during the current school year, and meet the age limits of Junior Drum & Bugle Corps (generally 14-22).
2. Audition for and be accepted as a performing member of a Junior Drum & Bugle Corps before applying. Documentation is required. For information on this procedure, visit: [www.dci.org](http://www.dci.org) or [www.cvbrigade.org](http://www.cvbrigade.org).
3. You must have parental permission if you are under age 18 *when* you apply.
4. Include a signed recommendation of your school music teacher, on school letterhead if possible.
5. Include a copy of your most recent academic transcript.

## How do I apply?

Complete the application form on the other side of this brochure, attach the required documentation and send to the GMACF office (*address on form*).

## How and when are awards made?

Shortly after the May 1 deadline, applications will be reviewed by the Grants committee. Their decision will take into account all of the application materials you submit, and will be final.

Awardees will be notified by U.S. Mail and a check for the monetary award will be mailed DIRECTLY to their Drum and Bugle Corps to be applied to the awardee's tuition.

All application materials are confidential, and will not be released to any other party unless required by law.
